5. SIXLINE

A wager covering six numbers and pays the odds of 5 to 1.

6. DOZEN

First, second or third, a wager covering a series of twelve numbers and pays the odds of 2 to 1.

7. COLUMN

First, second or third, a wager covering a vertical column of twelve numbers and pays the odds of 2 to 1.

8. EVEN CHANCES

A wager covering a select group of eighteen numbers ie, low (1 to 18) or high (19 to 36), red or black, odd or even numbers and pays the odds of even money.

The house margin is always the same at 2.7%

How To Play Roulette

Of all casino games, Roulette is the most exciting and colourful. It is a traditional game made famous in the great casinos of Europe.

Let us explain the number of different ways to place your bets.

Some of the chips used on the Roulette table differ to those used on other games. Each player may be given a different colour playing chip (known as wheel chips) to avoid confusion when placing bets. The value of these chips is set by you when you buy in at the table (remember to exchange your wheel chips back to cash chips when you leave the table as they may not be played on any other table).

To play, place your chips on the table layout, before the dealer announces 'No more bets'. When the ball comes to rest, the dealer will call out the winning number and place a marker on that number.

The excitement and fun heightens as a result of the many ways you can bet.

Note:


Where the winning number is zero all wagers shall lose except those wagers placed on zero and the combinations of zero.

1. STRAIGHT UP

A wager placed on any single number or zero, and pays the odds of 35 to 1.

2. SPLIT

A wager covering two numbers and pays the odds of 17 to 1.



3. STREET

A wager covering three numbers and pays the odds of 11 to 1.

4. CORNER

A wager covering four numbers and pays the odds of 8 to 1
